



A Note from Steve Zarelli, President of the Library Board of Trustees:

Over the past few years we've been busy upgrading the library based on your feedback. A new sign to better promote all the programs we offer and significant re-modeling, which reduced noise and made us more efficient in serving you. So, what's next?

Last year, Jennifer Richard, our Adult Services Librarian, proposed that we try a cake pan lending program. Admittedly, some of the staff and trustees had doubts! But, Jennifer made a passionate case and told us other libraries had success with similar programs. So why not give it a try? The program is off to a good start, but the real takeaway is that we are always looking for new and innovative ways to serve the community. We understand the needs of the community evolve. While we will continue to focus on the core expectations -- books, digital media and programming -- we are not afraid to experiment.

We also understand that budgets are on everyone's mind. The state-mandated increase to the minimum wage has had an impact on us and will continue to do so as it raises in steps over the new few years. With careful strategic planning and aggressive pursuit of grants, we plan to absorb the increased payroll costs with no negative effect on materials or programming. And we'll be able to do this while maintaining our historically conservative budget.

We are proud of our library and all the benefits it offers. There is always so much going on— the annual Tree Lighting, Scout meetings in the community room, school art shows, book clubs, book sales, and so much more. We really like to think of it as the "Town Center." What else would you like you see in your "Town Center?"
