Usage Trends

Library usage was on the rise in 2010, both in print and in the use of e-books and e-audio-books. Grants

In 2010, the Youth Services Department received a \$2000 Target grant to create a Town of Ballston Story Quilt, which will hang in the library when completed.

The library also received a \$916 "Fall Fiber Fun" grant from the Saratoga Program for Arts Funding (SPAF) Project Grants. Both children and adults created fiber art celebrating the farmland of Saratoga County. These programs were made possible by the Saratoga Program for Arts Funding (SPAF) part of the Decentralization Program, a re-grant program of the New York State Council on the Arts, administered by Saratoga Arts. Award



The library was able to purchase 6 computers, 2 printers, a scanner, and a receipt printer with a special legislative grant secured for us by Senator Hugh Farley.

Because we purchased the items through a group purchase and NYS contract, we were also able to offer 13 additional computer classes. These classes provide basic through advanced instruction in computer skills that are essential for the un– and under-employed, seniors, and others who wish to learn more about everything from Craigslist to Excel 2010.

Library patrons donated over 500 food items to the food pantry during Fines for Food, a special event that allows patrons to pay their fines with canned foods. We would like to thank Cub Scout Pack 83 for transporting the food for us.
